Residents' should seek shelter during the storm and listen to radio, television & base advisories.

If sirens should sound off, resident's should move to a pre-designated shelter, such as basement.

If an underground shelter is not available, move to a interior room or hallway on the lowest floor.

Stay away from windows.

Do not try to outrun a tornado in your car; exit the vehicle and find a safe structure or low lying ground such as a culvert or ditch.

NOTES OF INTEREST:

These procedures are briefed to the Military Member(s) by Rising View and HMO during the initial paperwork accepting their home.

At inception of the project, 2,600 homes were conveyed to the PO and of those homes, only 423 had basements. Currently, new development we have instate 1,640 homes and 156 have basements (all off base proper), with the exception of General and Chiefs Row that have basements.

Rising View has briefed the answering service as to these guidelines and reporting any power outages to OPPD immediately. The Rising View emergency technician is on site to assist with any questions and handle any emergency calls (weather permitting). After the storm, Management will survey the community and report any damages to the Director so repair plan/action can commence.

The Director will update Military Leadership after the storm as to any damages and plan to correct.

We encourage families to develop a severe weather action plan and have frequent drills.
